WHAT IS IT ABOUT?

The **I International Symposium on Environmental Justice in European Cities** will examine how social inequalities present in cities are related to the availability and access to nature, as well as exposure to unfavorable environmental conditions and their impact on the quality of life of the most vulnerable urban populations. The event will explore how these inequalities particularly affect groups such as immigrants, older adults, low-income individuals, or people with disabilities, fostering debate on building more equitable and inclusive cities. Over two days, research will be presented on the distribution of urban green infrastructures—particularly green and blue spaces—in various European cities, with contributions from international speakers. Additionally, within the framework of the R&D&I project GreenAndCITIES, social inequalities in access to urban nature in neighborhoods of Andalusian cities will be discussed, with special focus on the case of Seville, involving both scientists and local representatives.
